

CPE 70th Advisory: Standing Down of COVID-19 Measures for Private Education Institutions

10 February 2023

Dear Sirs,

- 1. The Multi-Ministry Taskforce (MTF) announced on 9 February 2023 that as the COVID-19 situation has remained stable in recent months, we will be stepping down the remaining COVID-19 measures and establish a new endemic COVID-19 norm.
- 2. A summary of key changes with effect from 13 February 2023, from MTF's announcement is given below:
 - Mask-wearing on public transport and indoor healthcare and residential care settings will no longer be required under the temporary COVID-19 regulations.
 - i. The Ministry of Health (MOH) will retain the practice of mask-wearing for visitors, staff and patients in healthcare and residential care settings - in particular, when there is interaction with patients and in patient-facing areas. This will be a MOH requirement rather than mandated under COVID-19 Regulations. Such requirements will also apply if there are healthcare settings within your institutions.
 - ii. Mask-wearing will still be required as part of sectoral or industry regulations, such as the Singapore Food Agency's requirement for food handlers to maintain good hygiene standards.
 - b. MOH will also stand-down Protocols 1-2-3 for the testing and isolation of COVID-19 cases. Private Education Institution (PEI) staff and students who are unwell or who have tested positive for COVID-19 are encouraged to continue exercising personal and social responsibility, by minimising social interactions, wearing masks, and avoiding crowded places.





[Updated] Reporting Procedure for COVID-19 Clusters

- 3. With the stepping down of community measures and shift to DORSCON Green from 13 February 2023, PEIs are no longer required to update MOH on any COVID-19 cluster within their premises as per indicated in the CPE 65th advisory. SSG will also be standing down the requirements in the COVID-19 advisories, last updated on 11 October 2022.
- 4. PEIs should take reference from prevailing community measures, while reminding staff and students to exercise individual and social responsibility. Should PEIs assess there is a need to impose mask-wearing or other additional requirements for specific settings, they should be ready to explain the rationale for such additional requirements.
